THE PROCESS

Creating Another Day in Paradise prioritized trust, dialogue, and empathy. Interviews were conducted with members of the unhoused community both in and outside of housing facilities, where interviewees shared their experiences, challenges, and hopes for the future. Participants were compensated for their time. Each conversation was recorded and transcribed to capture the exact language and speech patterns of participants, and those transcripts were used to create the characters you meet onstage. The result is this powerful piece of documentary theatre that portrays real-life struggles and resilience, giving voice, dignity, and authenticity to a community is often overlooked.

Another Day in Paradise began with a simple mission: to listen and connect. We are a company dedicated to amplifying the voices of the unheard, and creating a piece that highlights our unhoused neighbors has been a passion project for us for a number of years. We hope that *Another Day in Paradise* resonates with you, challenges your perceptions, and sparks conversations long after the curtain falls.
